

I. Introduction:

California has experienced unprecedented growth since the mid 1800's when waves of immigrants began pouring into California during the Gold Rush. Explosive growth continued during the 1900's following World War II. Our states population has continued its steady clime and is expected to do so through the 21st century.

Urbanization during the 1950's was increasingly centered on the automobile resulting in development patterns occurring in an inefficient manner, causing the sporadic formation of cities and special service districts. Cities amoeba like growth patterns set off the consumption of vast amounts of California's agricultural land. Premature and unplanned development created inefficient, expensive systems of delivering public services by various units of local government.

In response to California's inefficient urbanization during the 40's and 50's, the state legislature passed the Knox-Nisbit Act of 1963 resulting in the creation of Local Agency Formation Commission's or LAFCOs. Through the years, additional legislative acts have added more authority or additional powers to LAFCOs.

Kings County LAFCo is responsible for coordinating logical and timely changes in local governmental boundaries, conducting special studies that review ways to reorganize, simplify and streamline governmental structure and preparing a Sphere of Influence for each city and special district within each county. The Commission's efforts are directed to seeing that services are provided efficiently and economically while ensuring that agricultural and open-space lands are protected.

Through special studies, LAFCO's encourage governments to evaluate their current operations and options for reorganization. Local agencies often overlap and have the potential of duplicating services. LAFCO's conduct service studies and consolidation feasibility studies. These studies provide general information about local governments and present alternatives for improving services and reducing operational costs.

This special study is intended to provide the Commission and the public with information regarding the types of special districts in Kings County and to provide maps of their boundaries. The maps within this study depict the overall boundary and sphere of influence for each city and each active special district within Kings County. II. Cities

Cities are general purpose local governments which provide a variety of municipal services specifically tailored to meet residents specific needs. Communities which make up a city have local control over growth, development, and land uses. Cities operate under California laws and are governed by their own elected councils.


Large metropolitan cities are capable of providing their residents with a full range of municipal services. Smaller cities may rely on special districts to provide specific services or they may opt to contract with the county, another city, or a private company for services. Services commonly provided by cities include:


- Public safety (police, fire, building inspection, etc.)
- Local streets, roads, transit, airports, harbors
- Public utilities (usually solid waste and local sewers, sometimes water and electricity)
- Parks, recreation, libraries, museums, arts
- Planning and zoning


In 1972, LAFCos were given the power to determine spheres of influence for all local governmental agencies, including cities. A sphere of influence (SOI) is a planning boundary outside of an agency's legal boundary (similar to a city limit line) that designates the agency's probable future boundary and service area. The purpose of the SOI is to ensure the provision of efficient services while discouraging urban sprawl and the premature conversion of agricultural and open space lands by preventing overlapping jurisdictions and duplication of services.


A Secondary SOI has also been established by Kings County LAFCo. A Secondary SOI is the boundary beyond the Primary SOI and includes additional territory that serves only as an area of planning interest to the city or community district. This area is typically beyond the planned urban areas identified in a city or the county's general plan.

Commissions do not have the authority to tell local agencies what their planning goals should be. However, when a city desires to alter its boundary and add additional contiguous land into its jurisdictional control through an annexation, the city must first obtain LAFCo approval. Kings County contains four incorporated cities, Avenal, Corcoran, Hanford and Lemoore. Exhibits 1-5 contain maps depicting the cities current boundaries, their Primary SOI, and Secondary SOI boundaries.









III. Special Districts

Special districts are a type of local government established by residents of a community or geographical area for the purpose of providing a specific set of services not provided by a city or county. A Special districts authority to operate is defined by various sets of State law's which authorizes special districts to perform or provide those certain limited functions within an established boundary. Some types of special districts are authorized by law to perform only one type of service while other's may perform many services or activities.

Special districts can be located inside a city, adjacent to a city within a city's urban fringe, or in a county unincorporated area. It is common throughout California for suburban or rural residents to elect to form special districts to provide needed services rather than incorporation to form a city.

Districts do not have broad governing authority and cannot determine land uses within their geographical boundary. Land use control remains with either the board of supervisors or the city council. Within unincorporated communities throughout California community services districts or public utility districts have assumed nearly a full range of municipal functions.

The sizes of special districts tend to be associated with the type of services the district provides and can vary tremendously. A reclamation district, for example, may encompass only a single parcel or two, while a water district may encompass several counties. It is common for residents in unincorporated areas to be served by numerous special districts in order for those residents to receive all their desired services.

Special districts are classified as either independent or dependent, according to the type of governing body under which it operates. Independent special districts operate under a locally elected independent board of directors, with fixed terms, typically comprised of citizens living within the districts boundary. These districts make their own program and spending decisions free of board of supervisor or city council oversight. An example of an independent special district is a community services district. A dependant district operates under the control of a county board of supervisors or a city council, such as a county service area.

LAFCo's role concerning special districts is similar to that of a city. LAFCO determines the SOI for the district, which is used to delineate the area into which the district can potentially extend its services following LAFCo approval. Any change of organization or boundary to an existing district is also reviewed for approval by LAFCo.

At present, Kings County has 48 special districts where all or a majority of the district boundaries are in Kings County. There are 9 districts where the majority of the district resides in adjoining counties and thus are under the authority of another LAFCO. The special districts are depicted in Exhibits 6 through 56.


